Advice from Year 13

- **Utilise study periods effectively**

- Make a revision plan and revise from the beginning

- Don't leave everything until the end, start revising early
- Organise time inside and outside of school
- Balance time wisely between social and academic
- Take care of your health
- Start looking at Universities early
